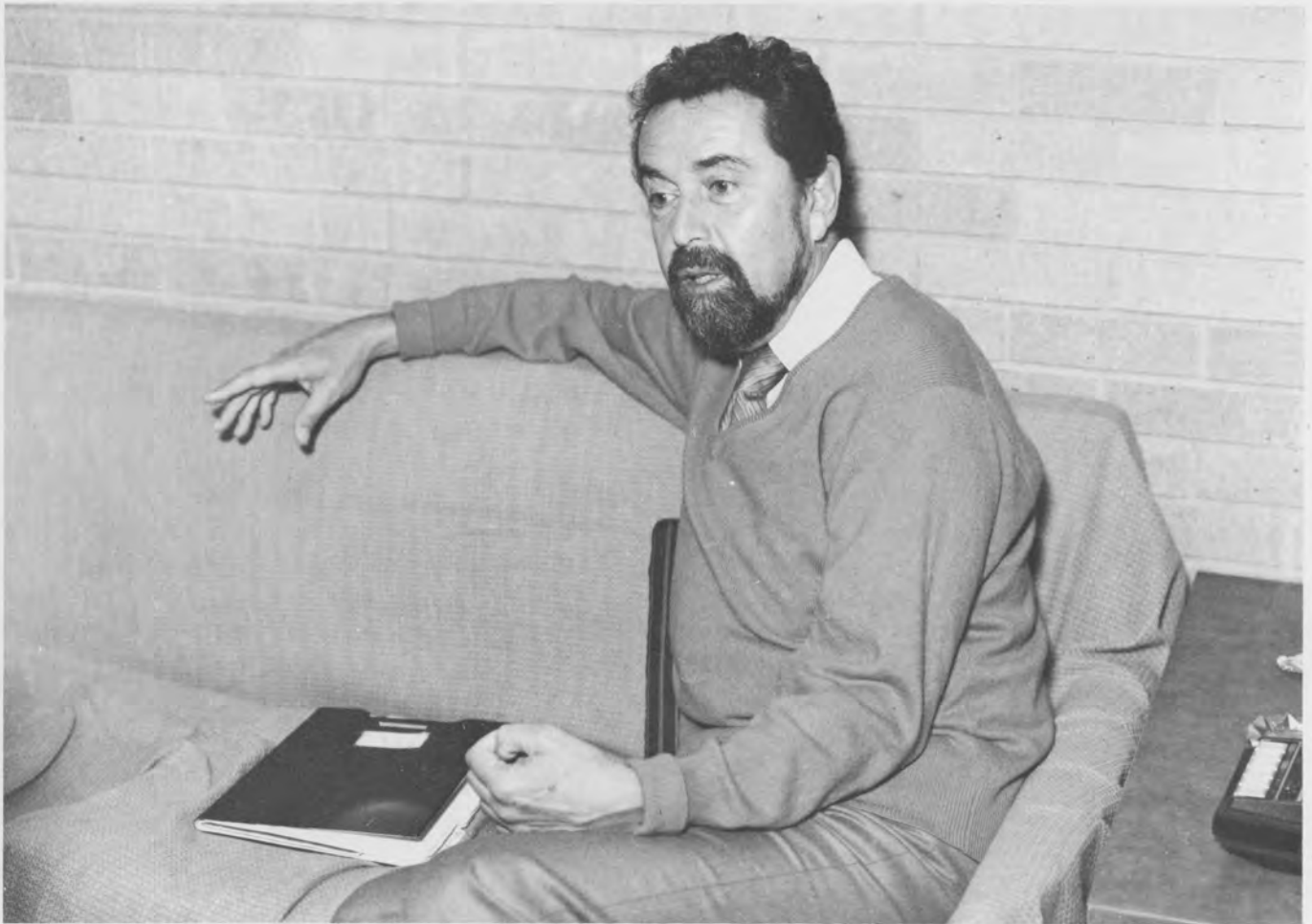

Love Doctor

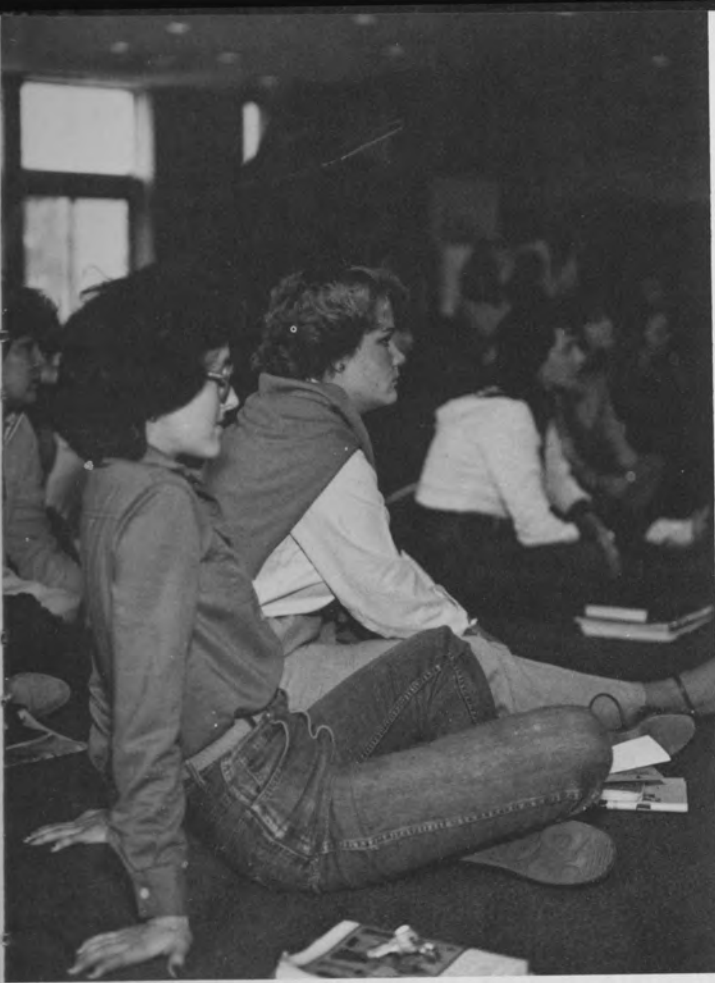


Dr Leo Buscaglia referred to as "The Love Doctor," visited Columbia College campus last fall and brought his message and expression of "Love" to the entire Campus. Being a Professor in the Department of Special Education at U.S.C. since 1969 has given him the opportunity to guide many along the paths of humanness. He is a person who truly lives as he speaks, who feels and is not afraid of displaying his emotions and one who truly loves.

"You've got to be a little bit crazy to survive in this world" the Love Doctor told C.C. students and they believed him. 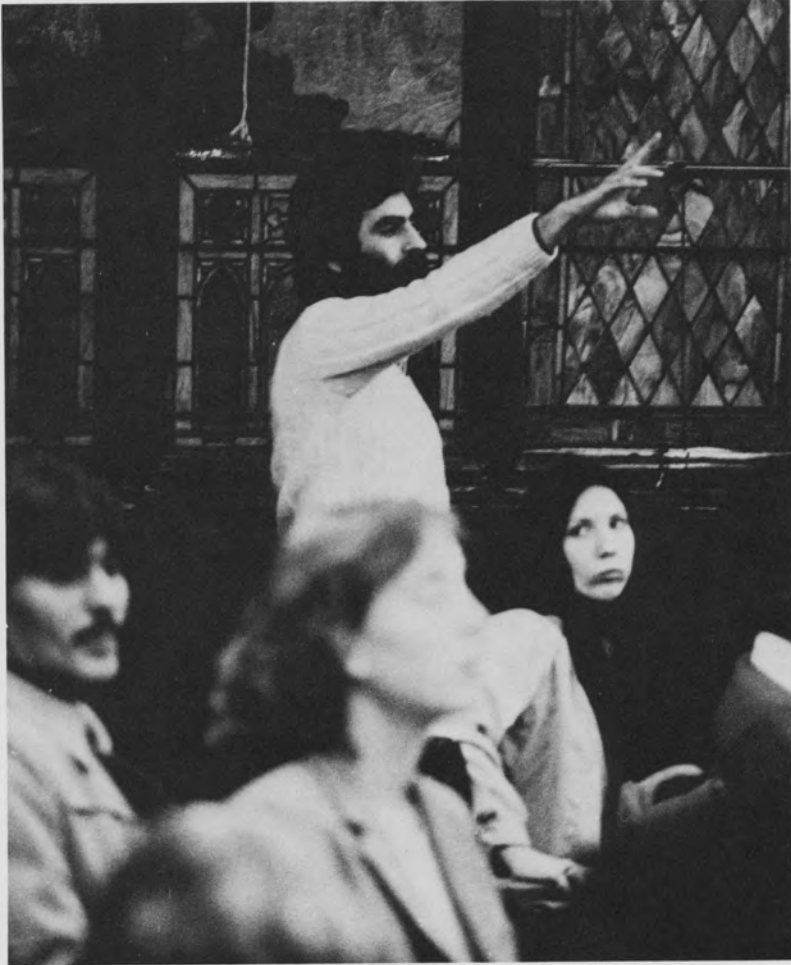

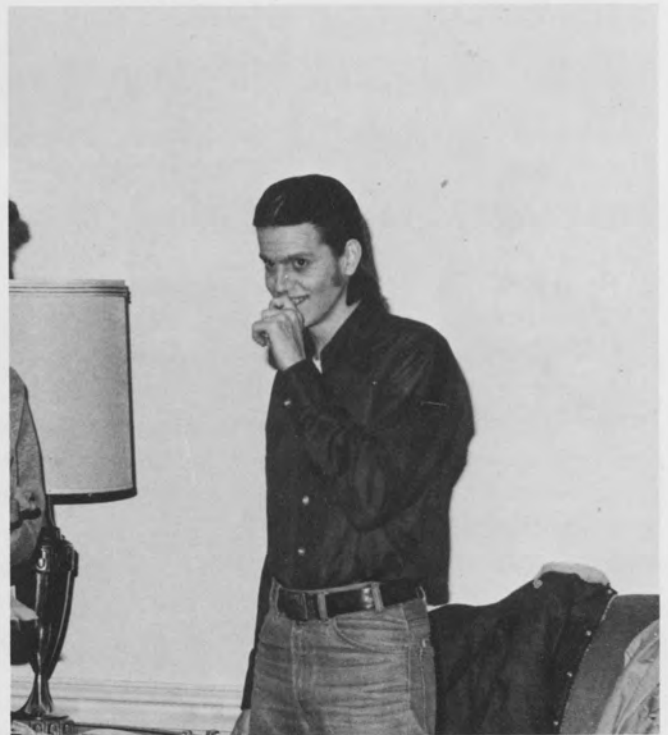

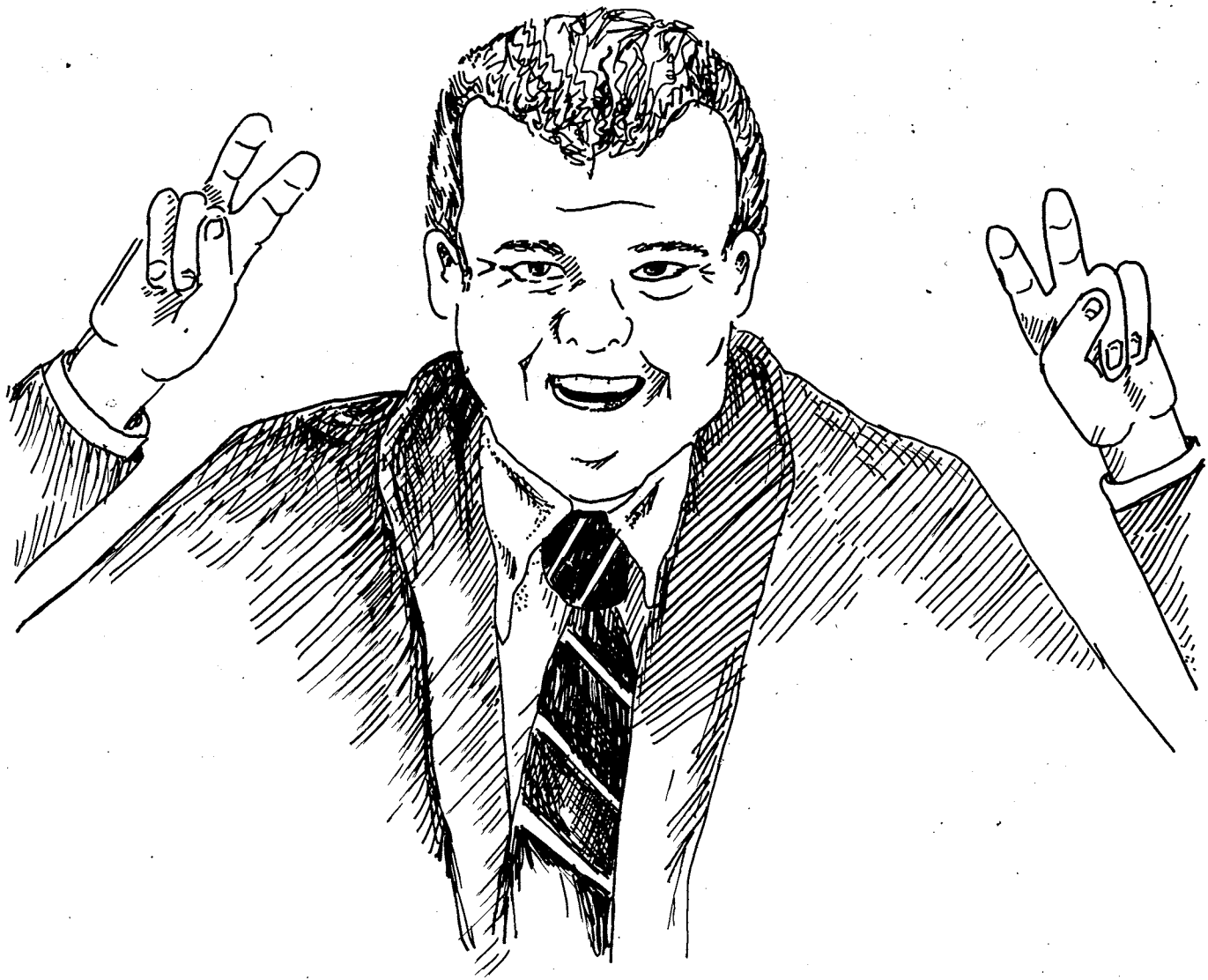

President Kelly

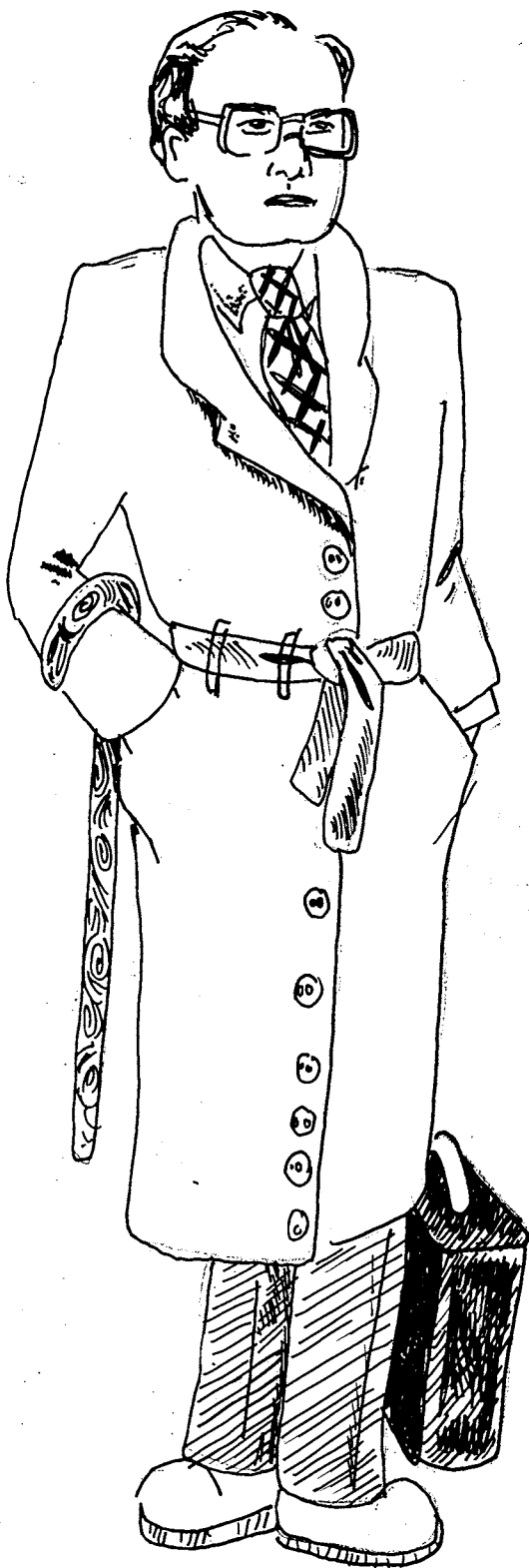

This has been only one example of his importance to C.C.

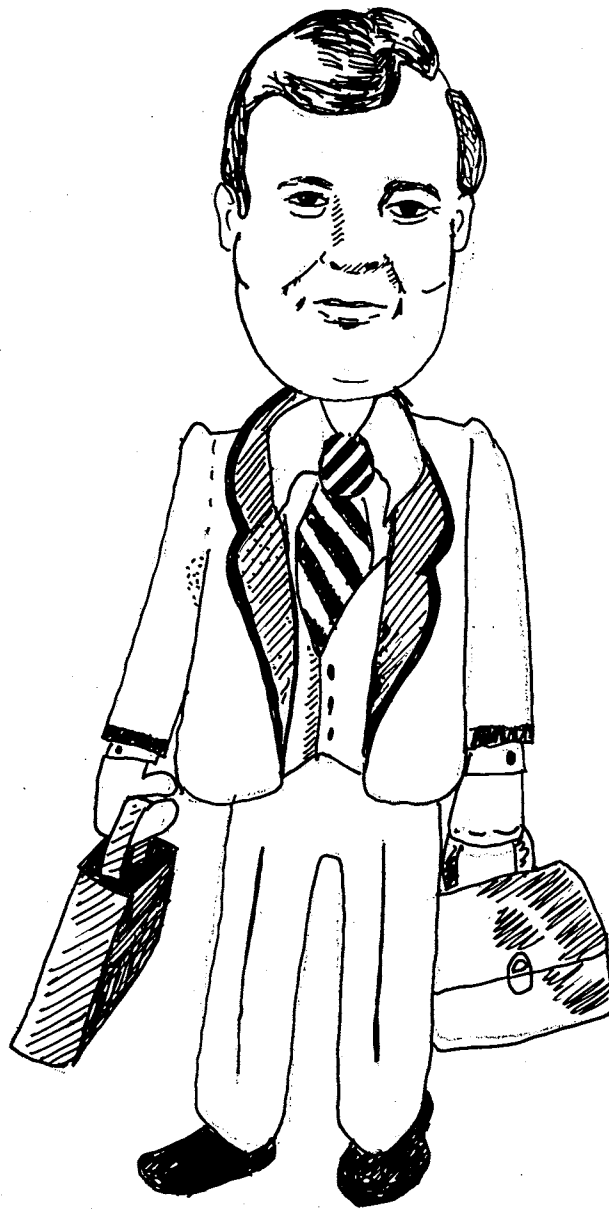
Dean Harris

Dean Drennan



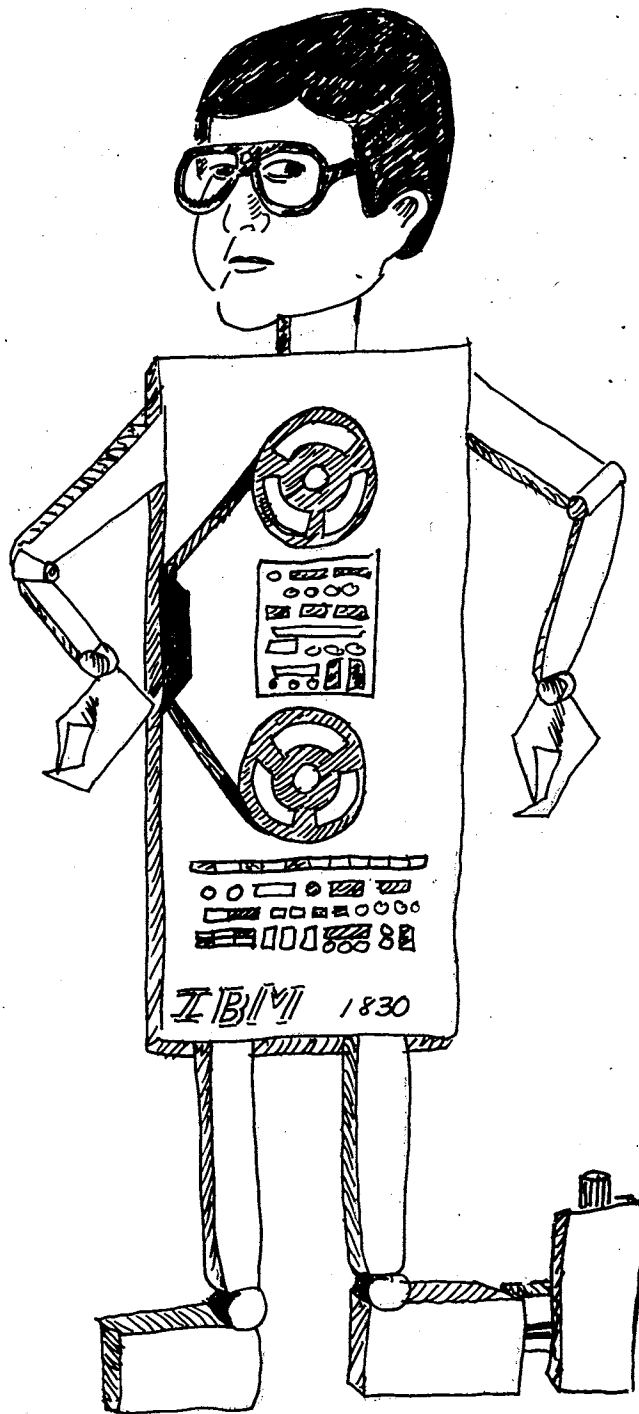

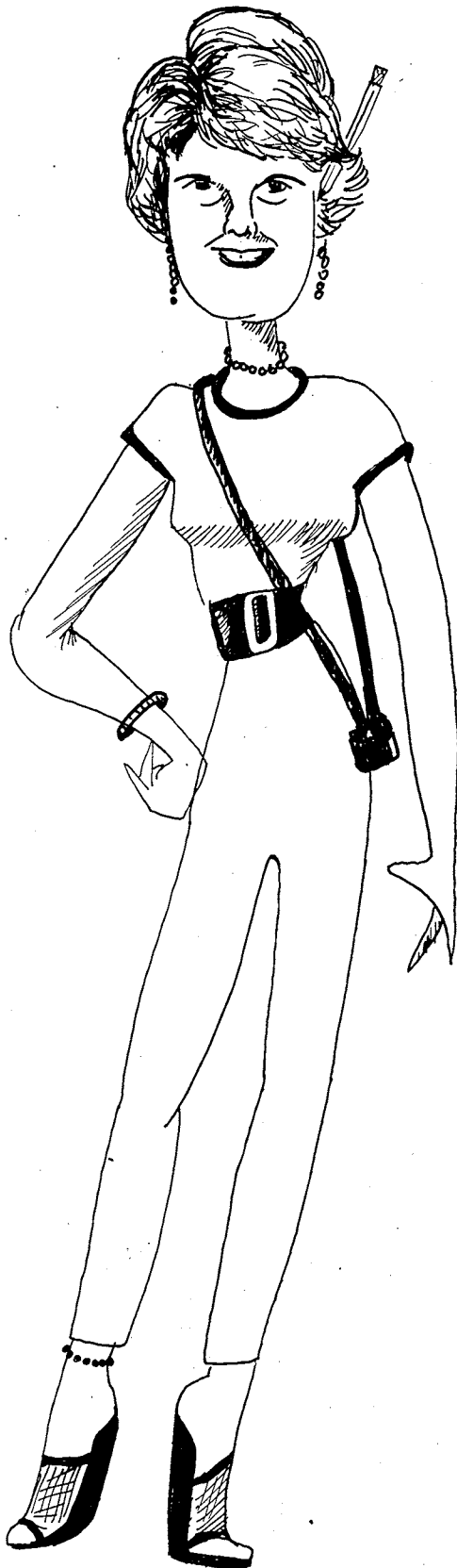
Dean Godfrey

The December Graduates got to "Boogie Down" with Dr. Boudreaux. Wow! Was he ever stepping out.

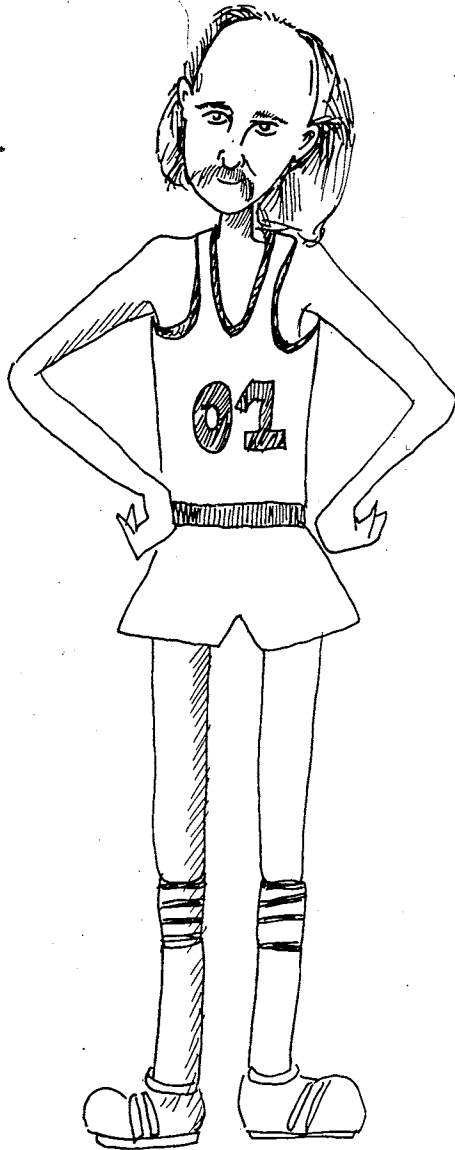


Dr. Bruce Stranad And Summer Allen

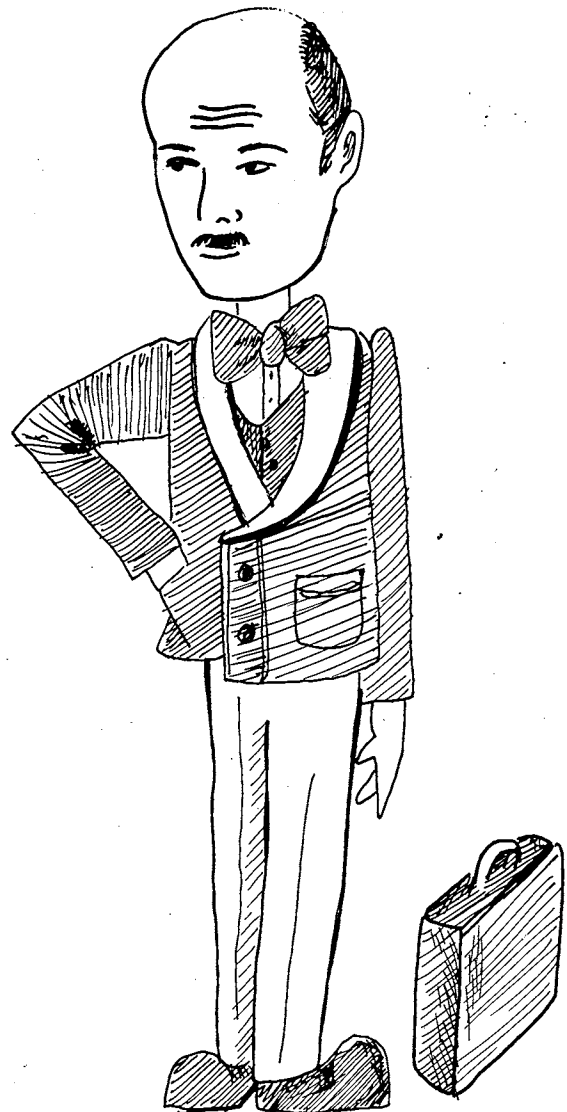

John Henricks And Rich Allen

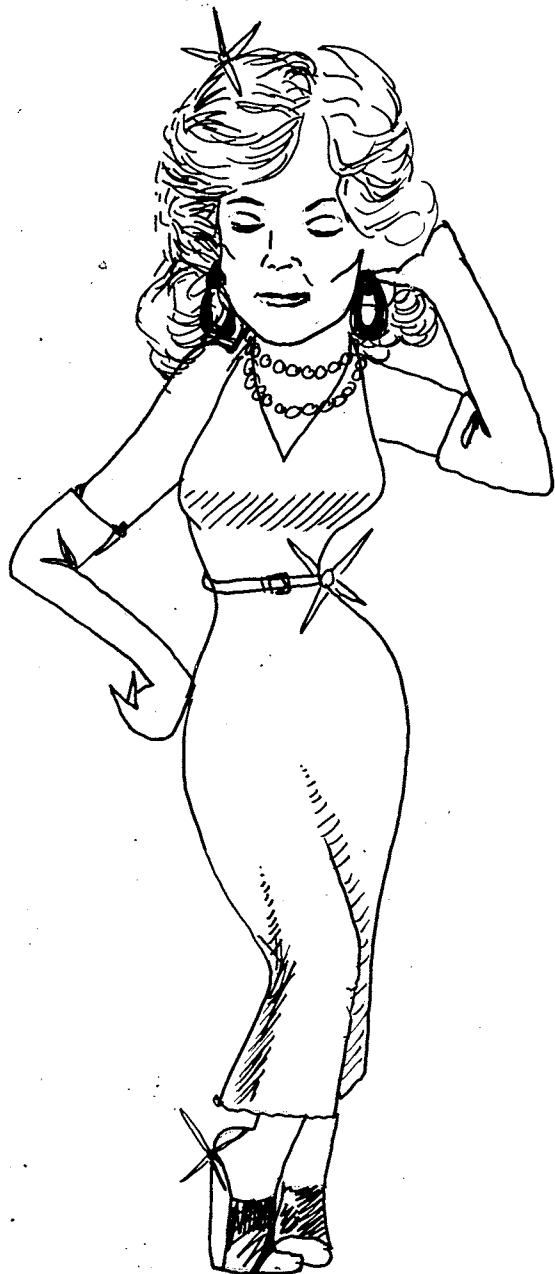

Kathy Posche And Marsha Voss

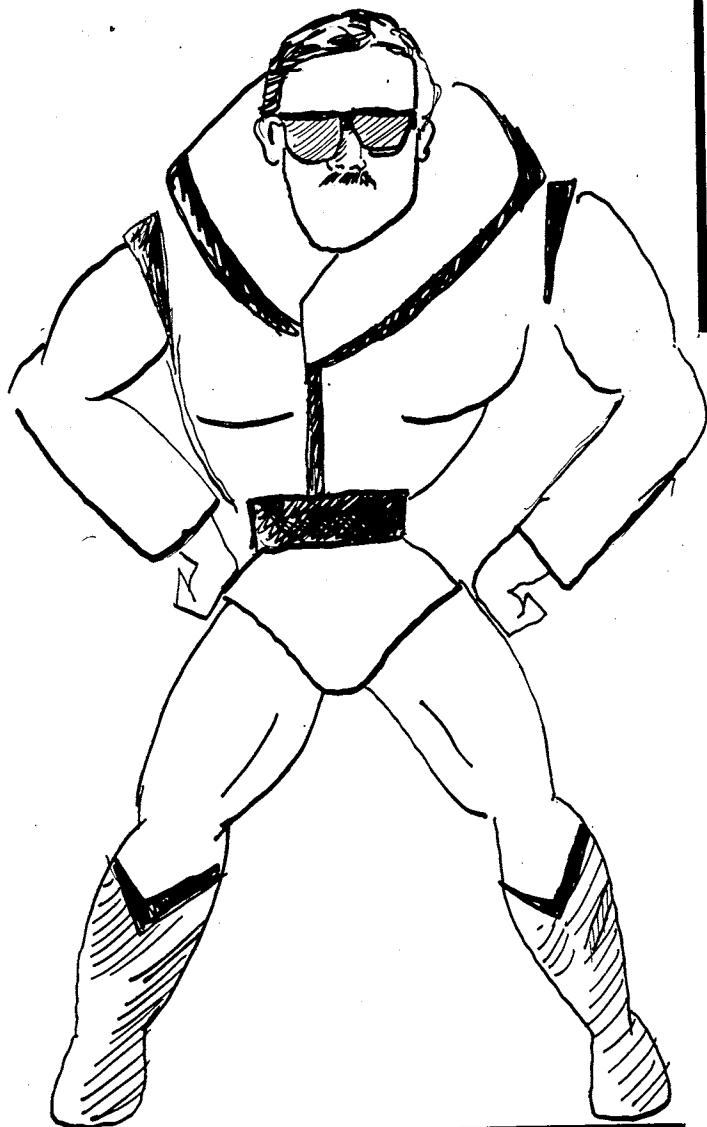

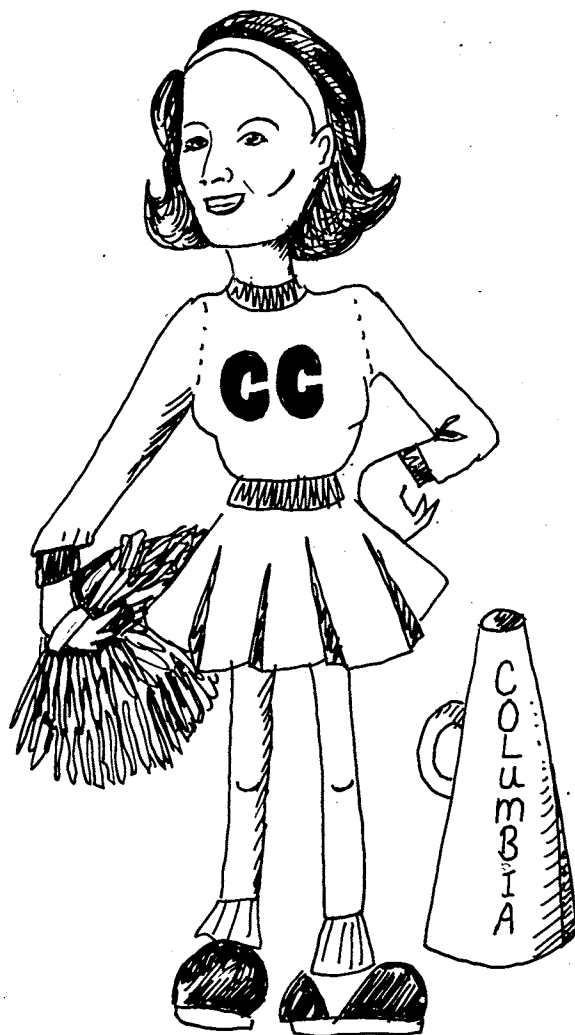
Student Financial Aid headed by Marsha Voss, is vital for many of C.C.'s students: Her office is where scholarships and Loans are reviewed.

Kim Dude-Jones And Joe Nicchetta

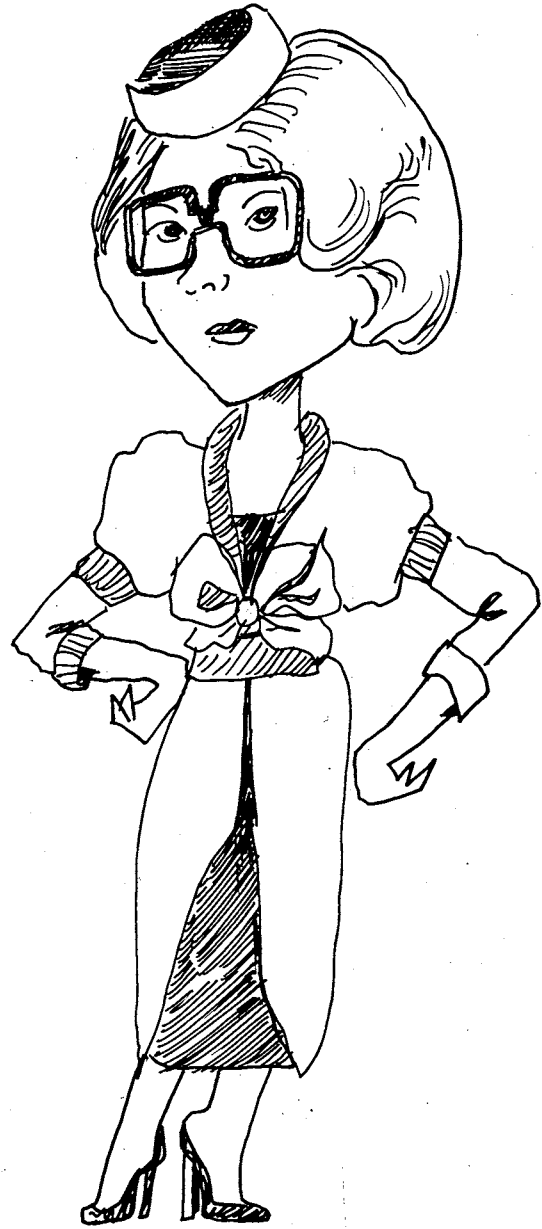
