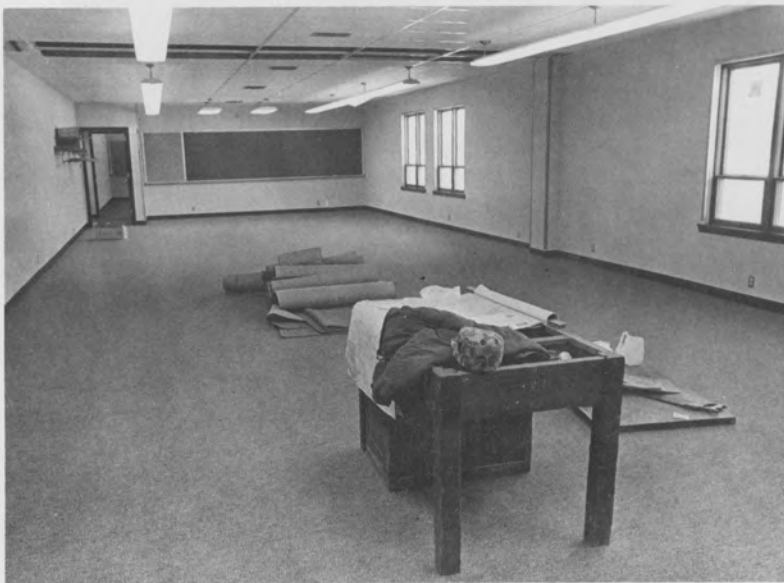








## *Expansion*

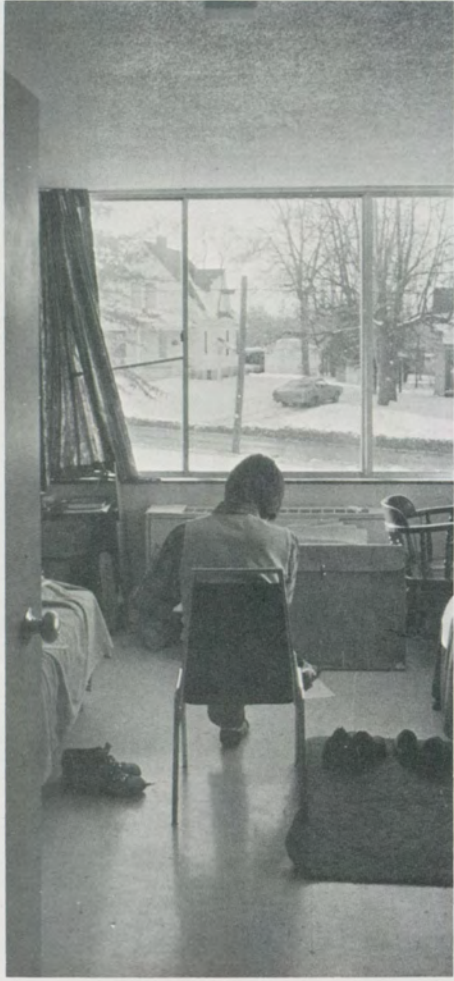


The new \$175,000 classroom building, complete with computer accessory, was dedicated during ceremonies in the month of April.

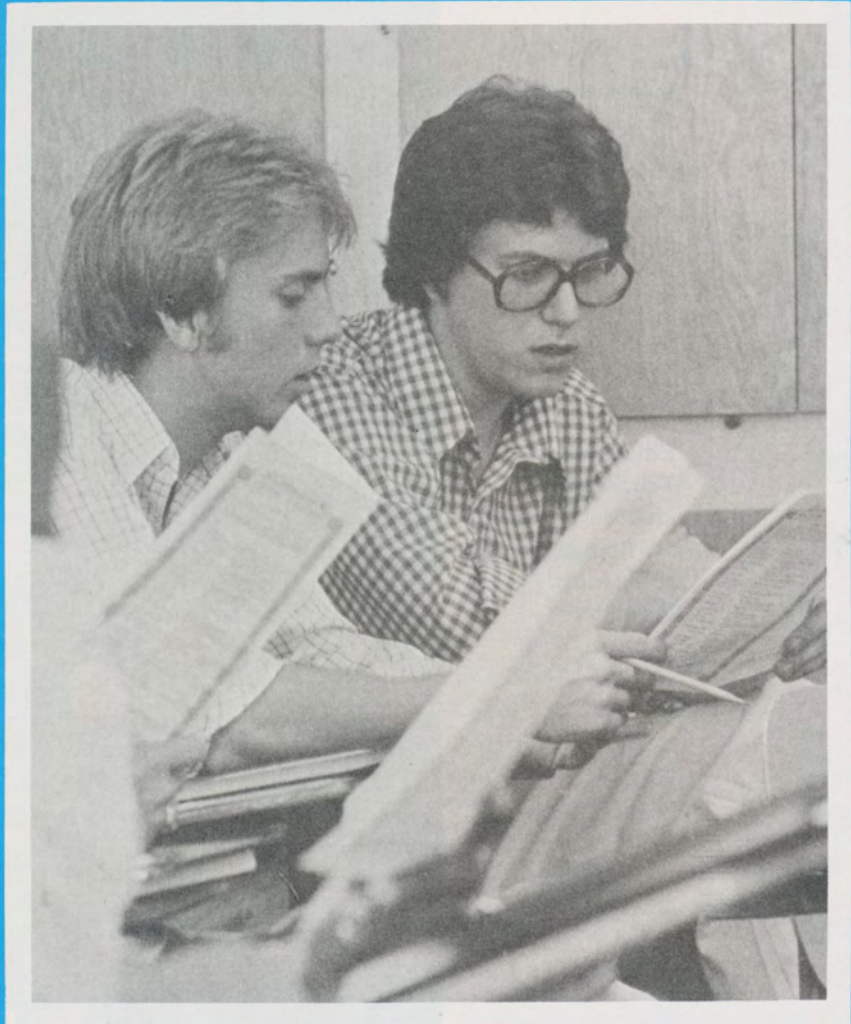
In all, the faces and facilities became a welcome sight, and everyone looked on the expansion as a progressive step for the 1977 school year at Columbia College.







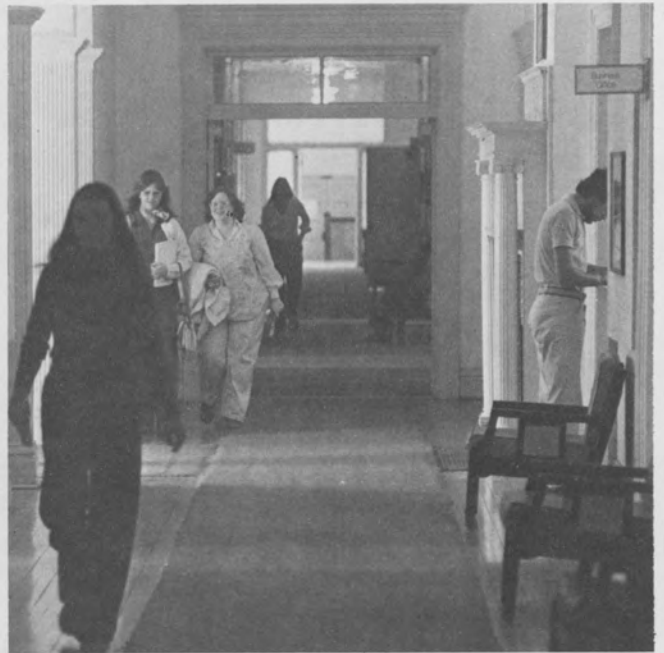

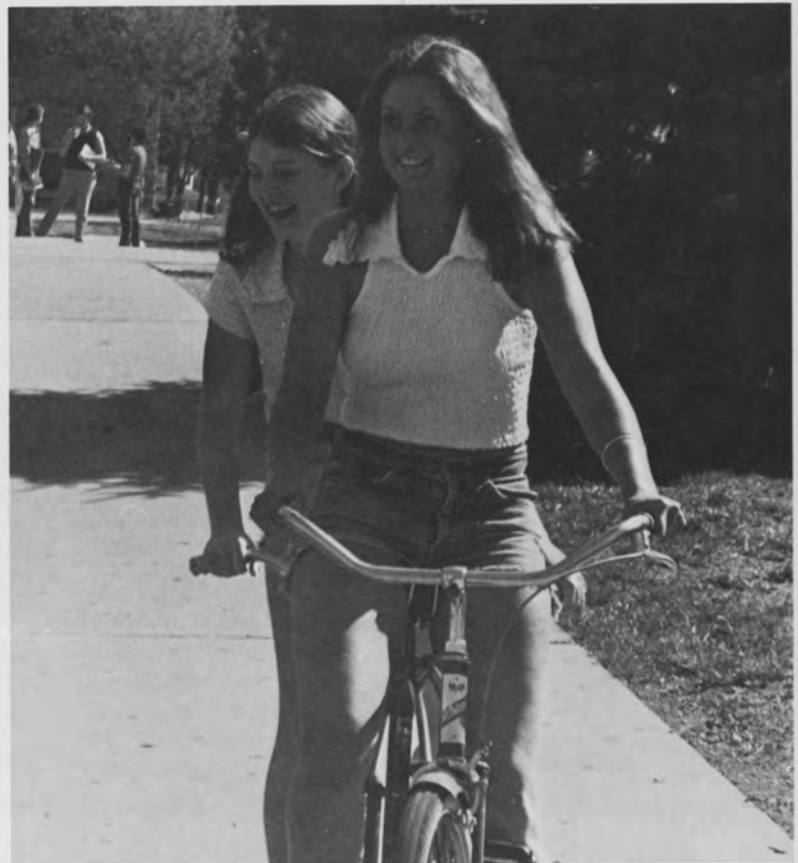


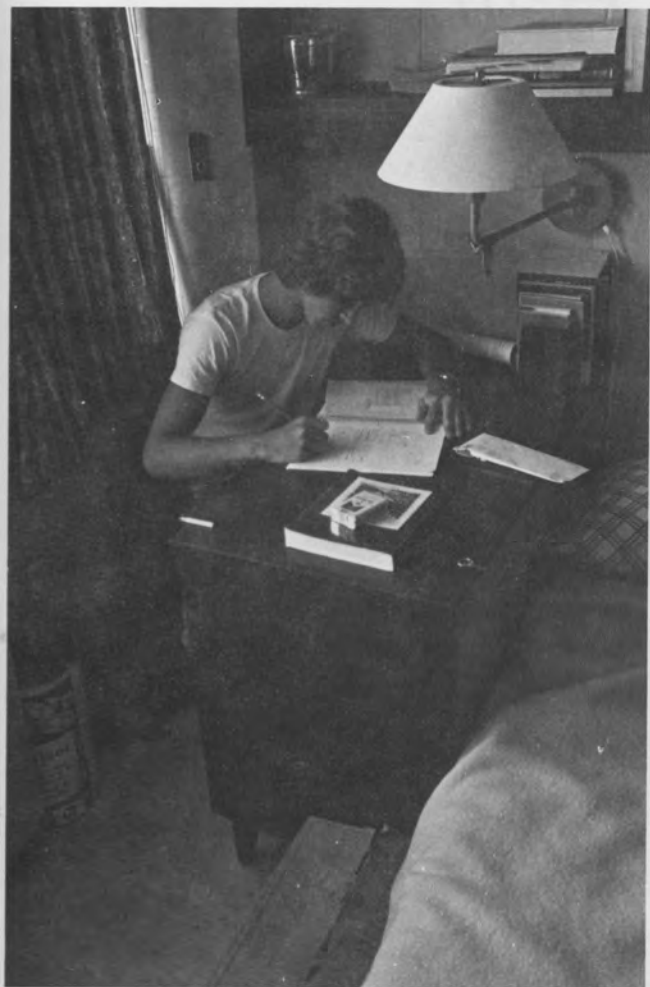


## *Miller Hall*

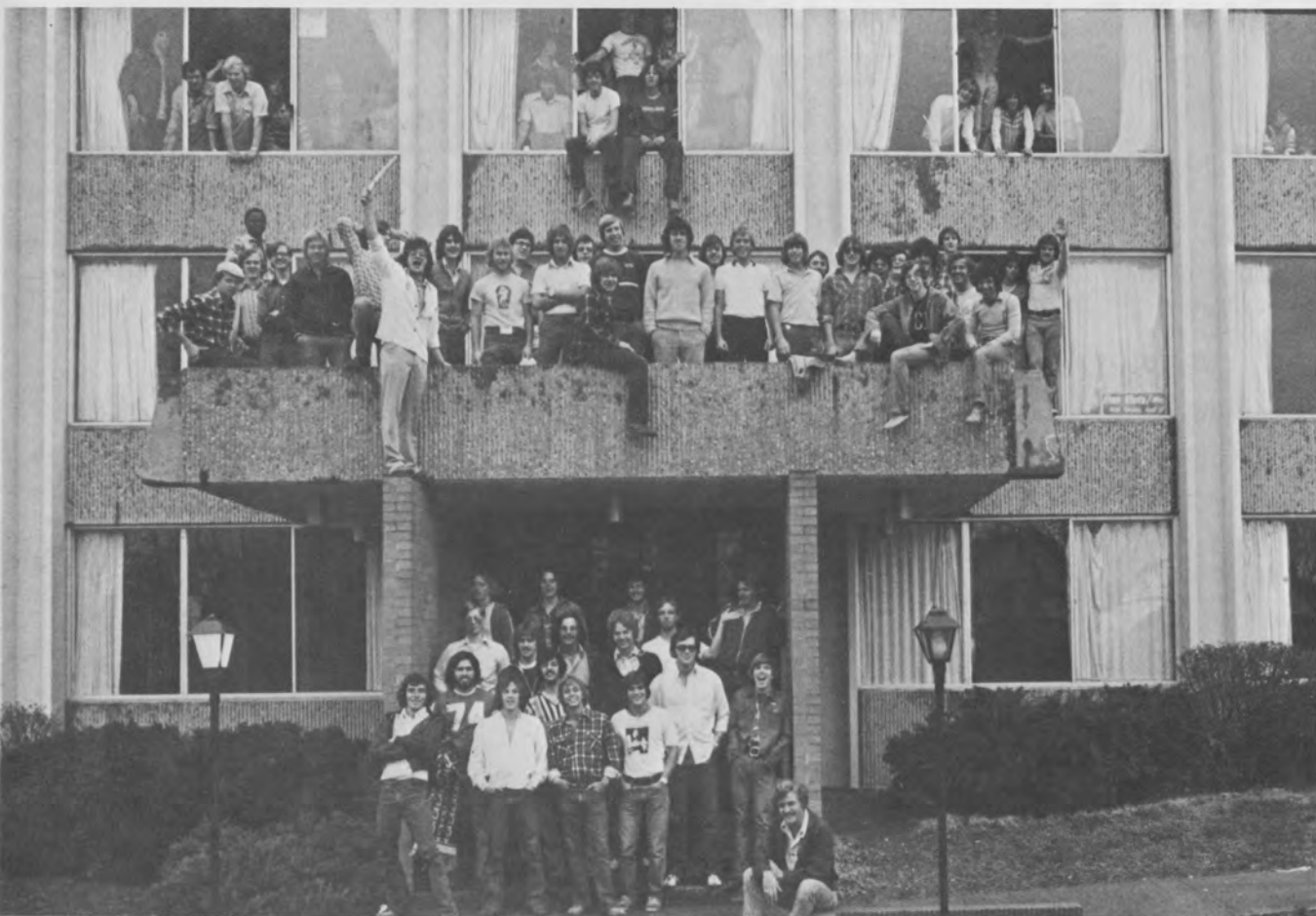




## *Banks Hall*

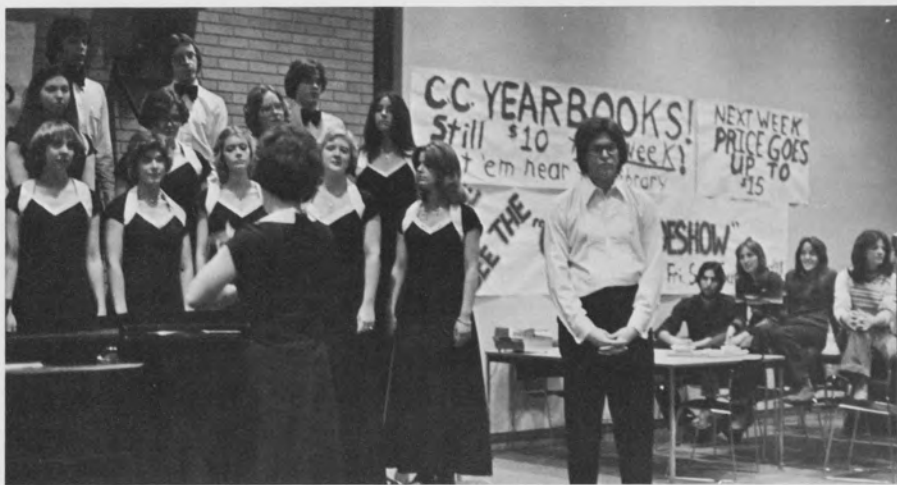
The Forward Motion dance group performs on campus during College Weekends and at special activities. Their major event for the year was the Dance Concert held on April 14 and 15.

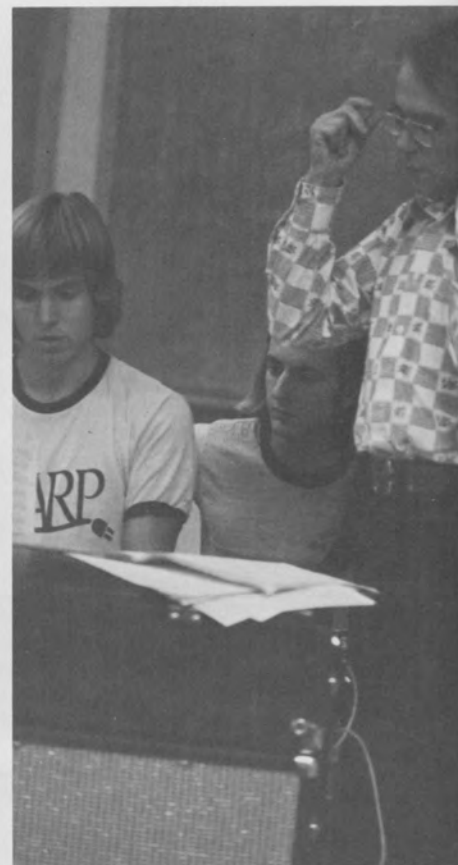


## Concert Choir

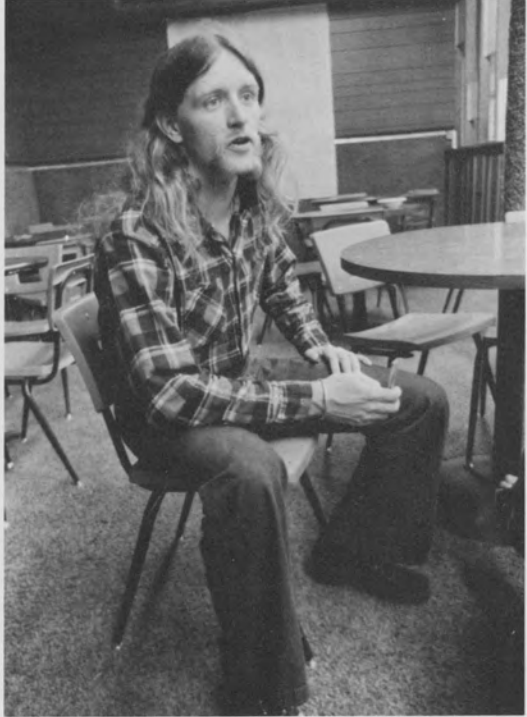

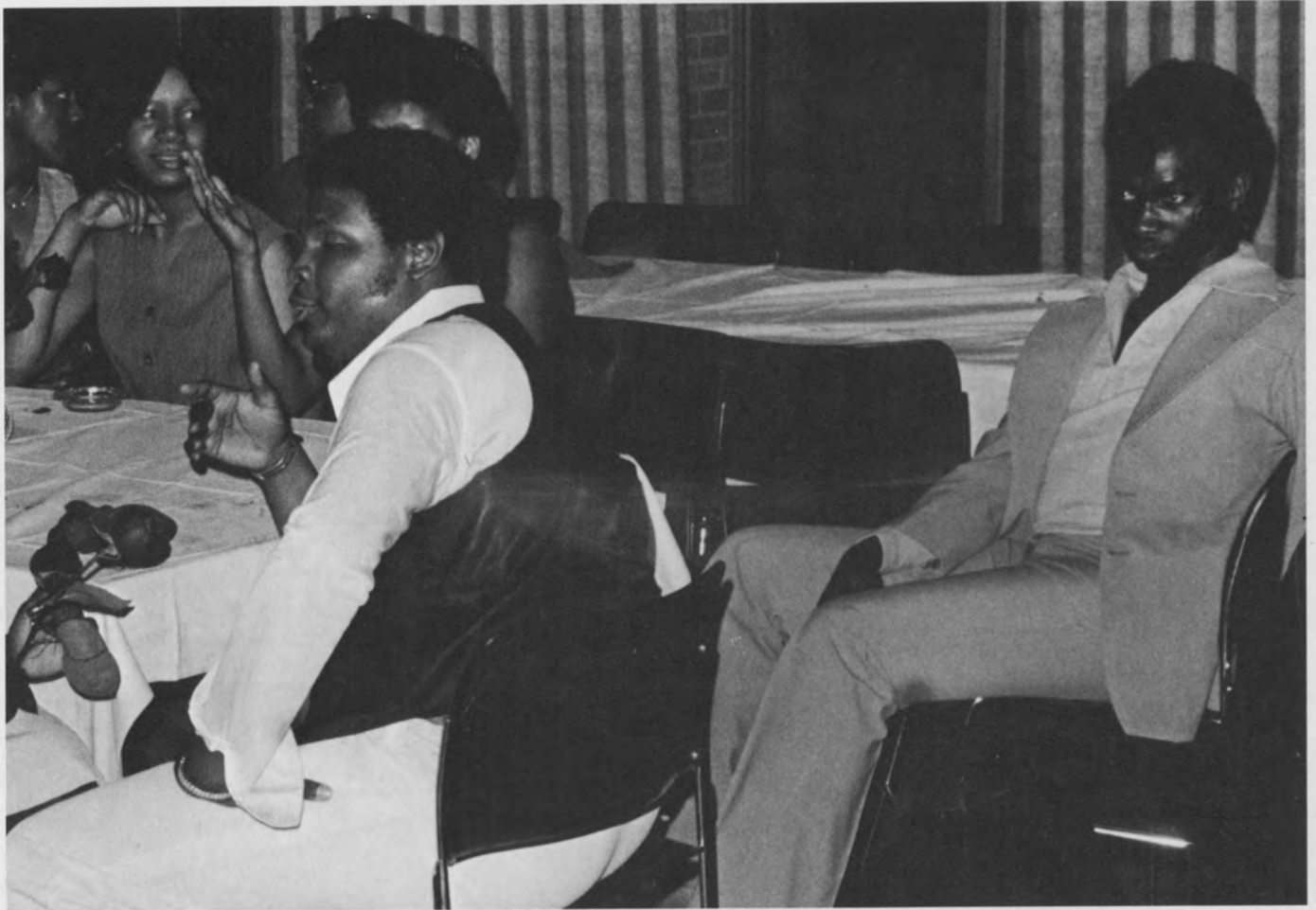

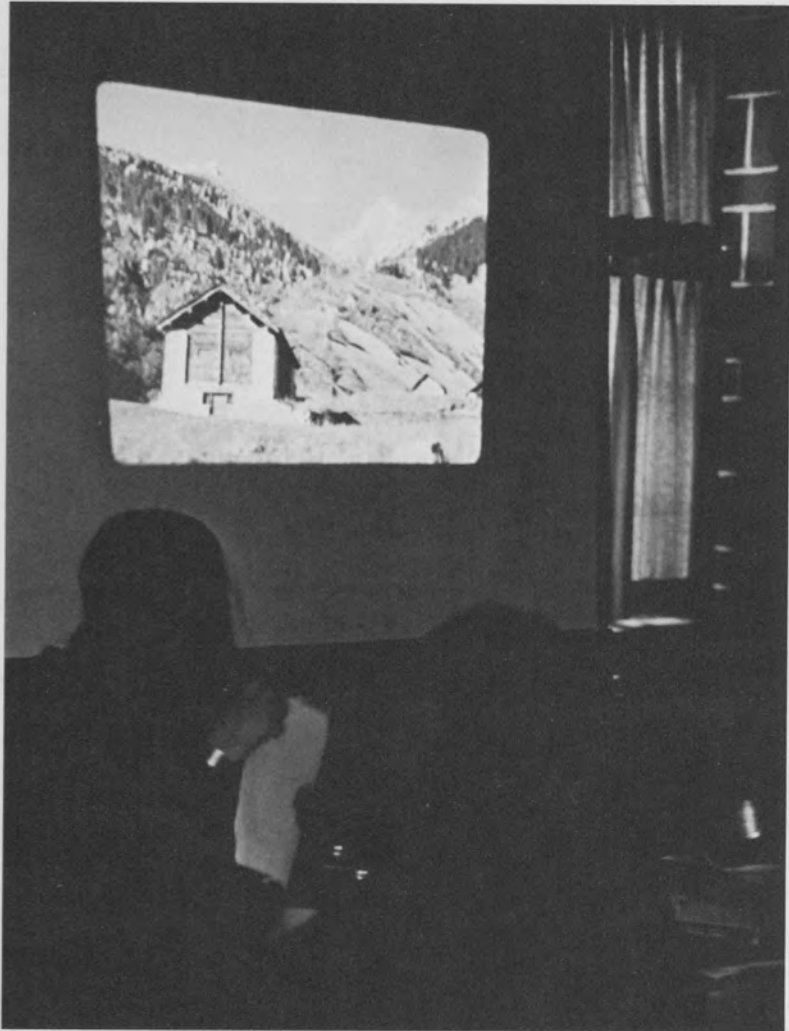


## *Campus Ambassadors*

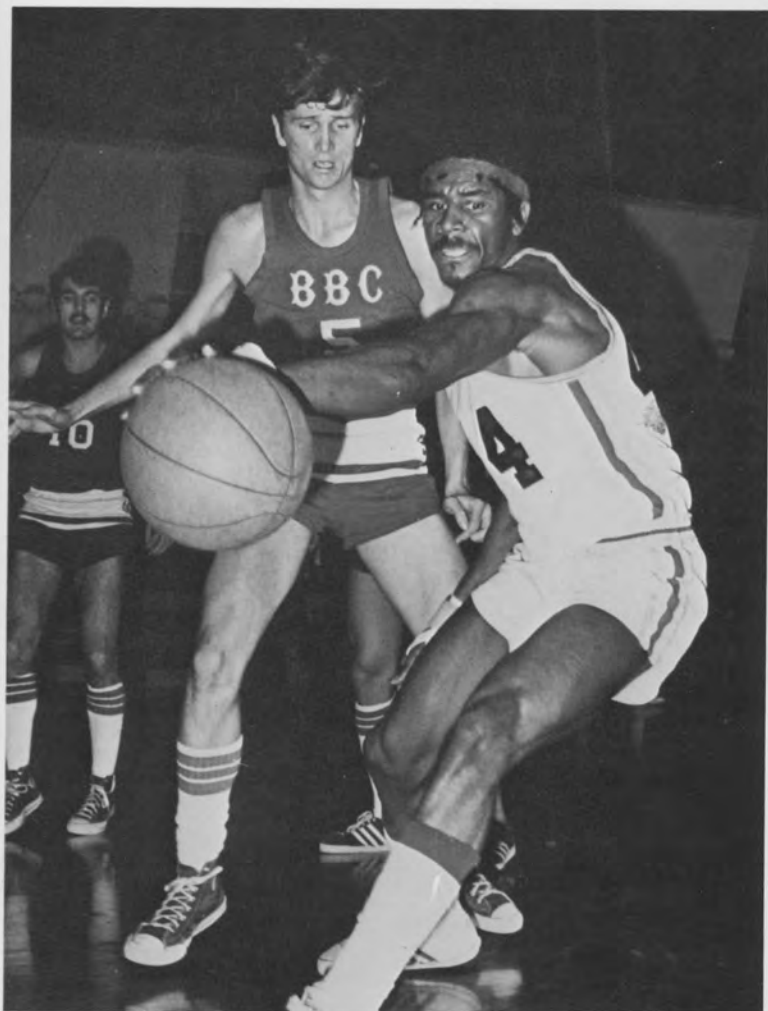
## Soccer

## *Men's Basketball*

This was the first season the men's Centaur basketball team competed as members of the 16th District of the national Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. Unfortunately, the Centaurs finished the season with a 10-8 record.

Though starting the season slowly, the Centaurs began picking up games toward the end of the season. They won eight of the last 10 games; in four of those victories, the men scored well over 100 points. However, the new computer rating system pronounced C.C. last in its division.

Leon Harris led the Centaur men in scoring with a season average of 25.2 points. Greg Logan, who at one time this season led the nation in rebounds (NAIA), finished the year with a 22.3 point scoring average.

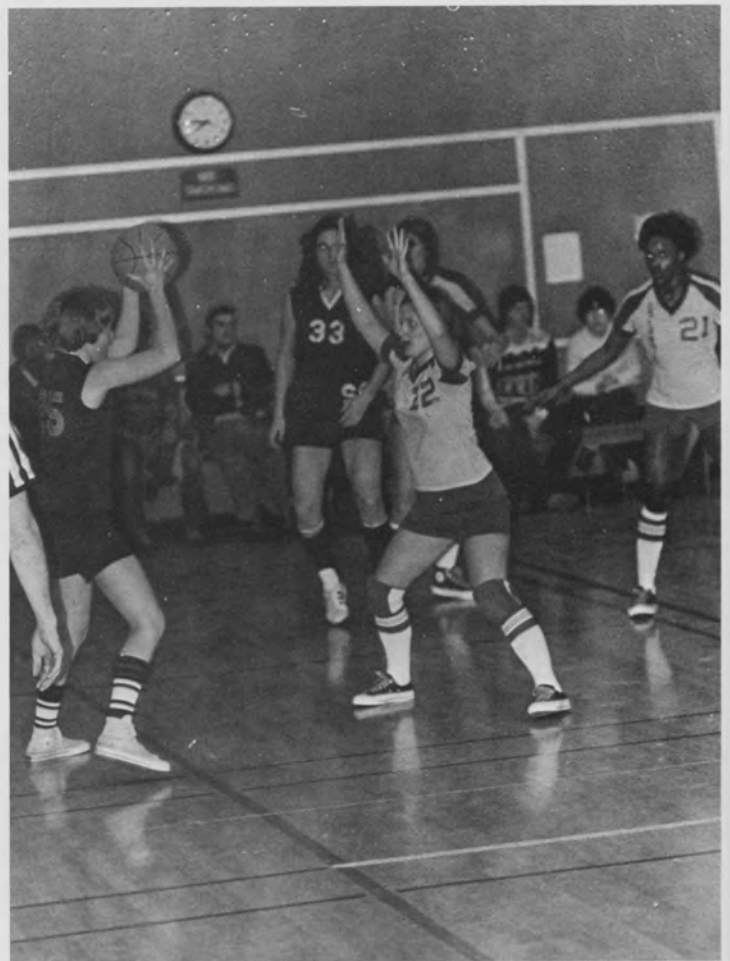
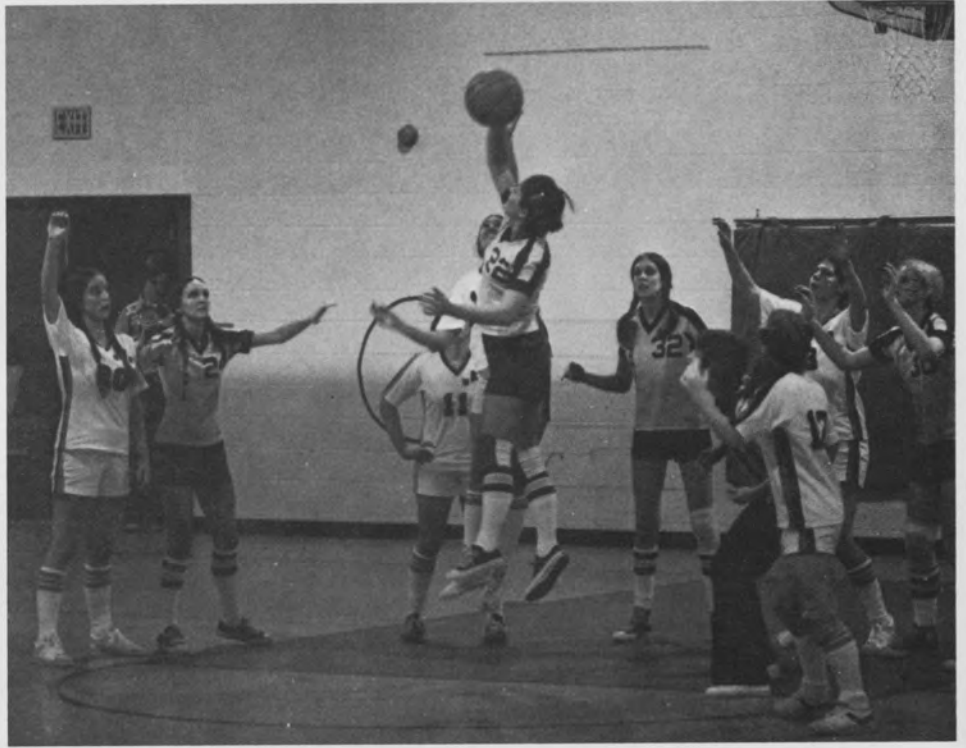
Harris and Logan will return next year, as well as other starters: Ron Wilson, Al Terrill, and Bob Harris.

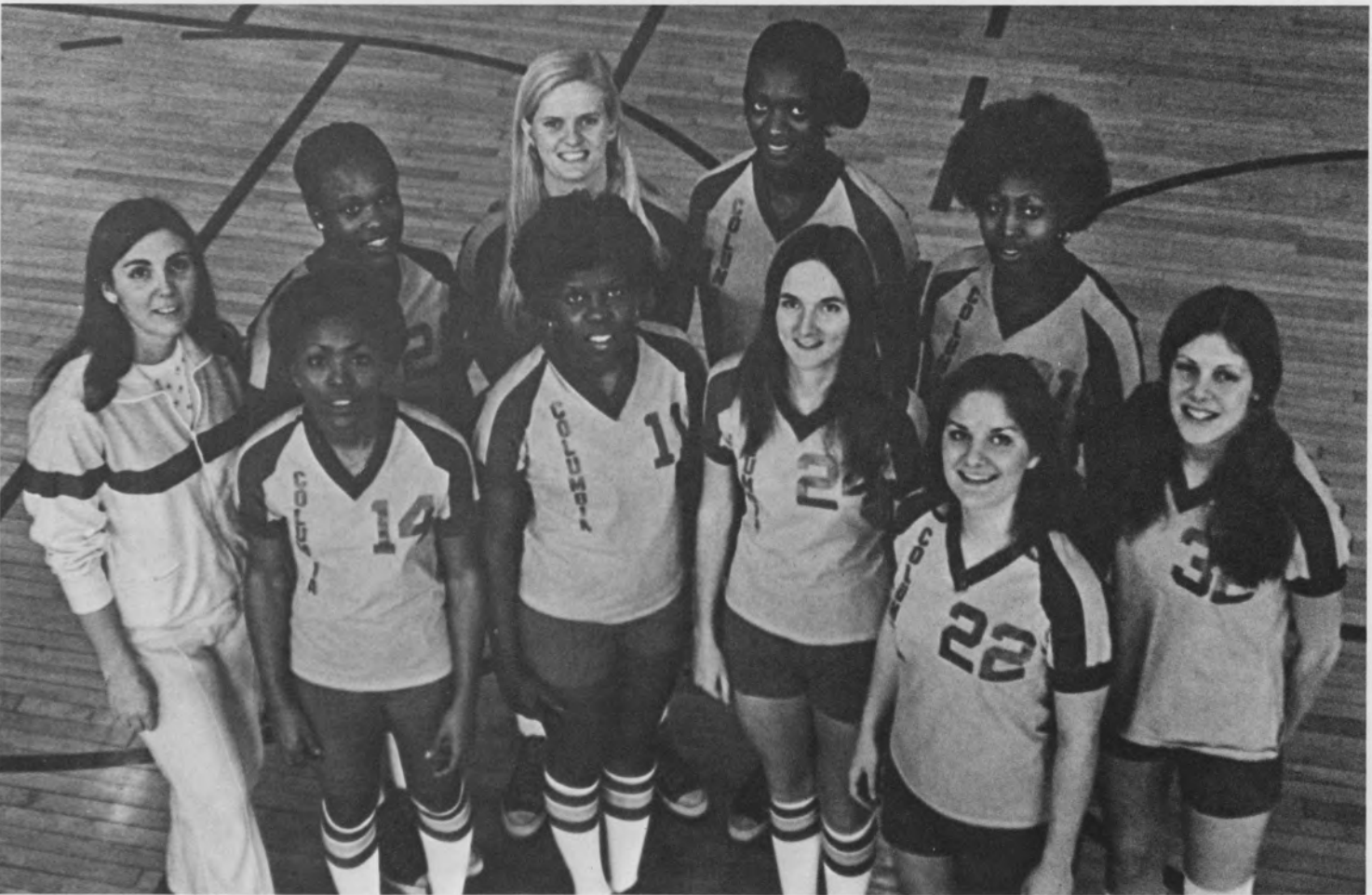
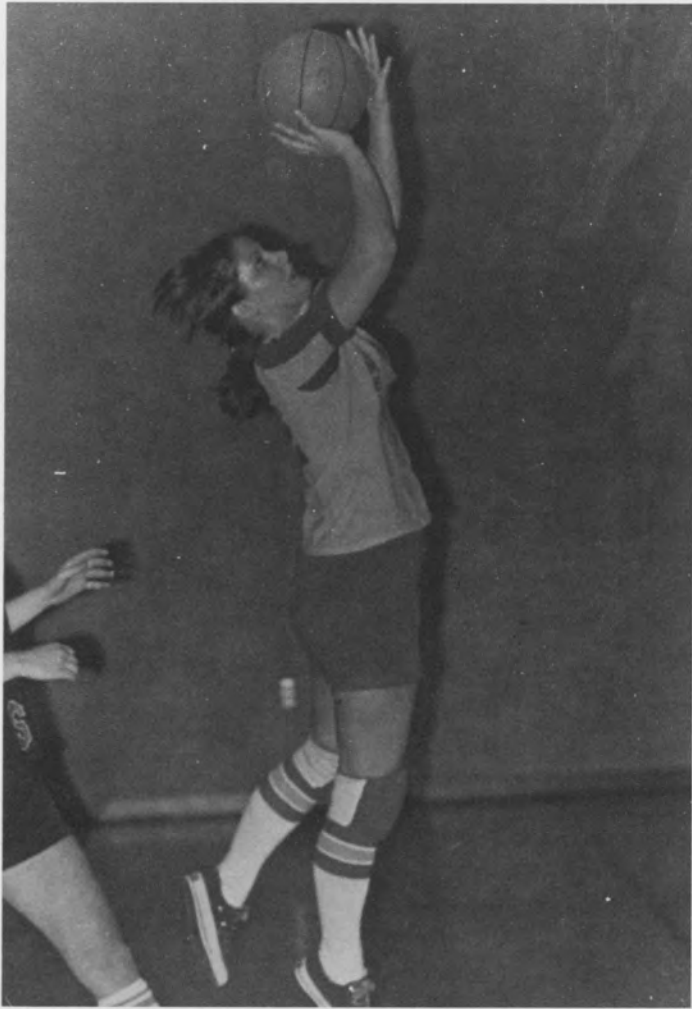


## Women's Basketball

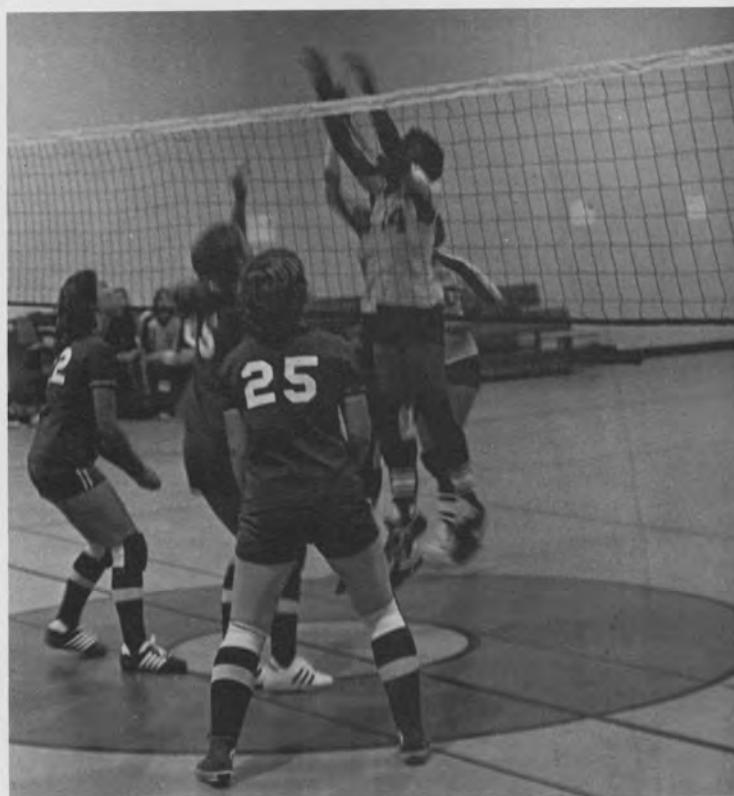
## Softball/ Volleyball

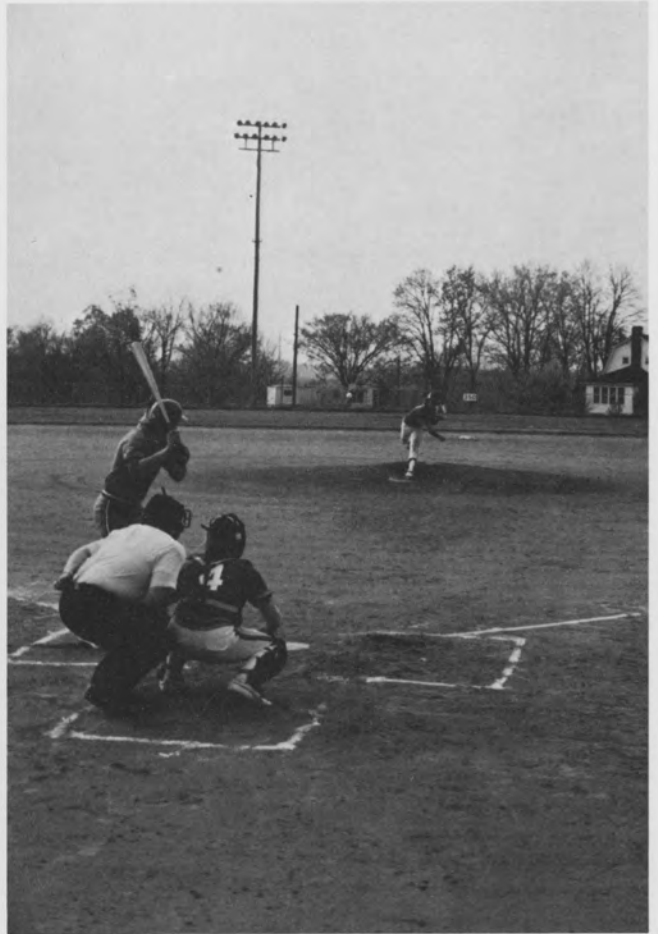

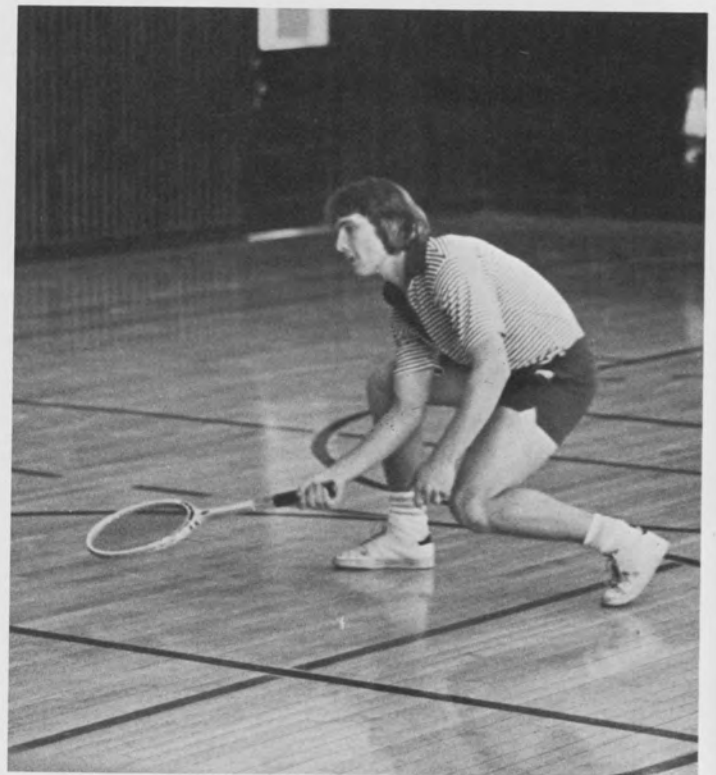


## Tennis

Coach Dennis Oberg is hopeful about the 1977-78 team and is looking toward the reunion of his tennis team with the coming of new students.



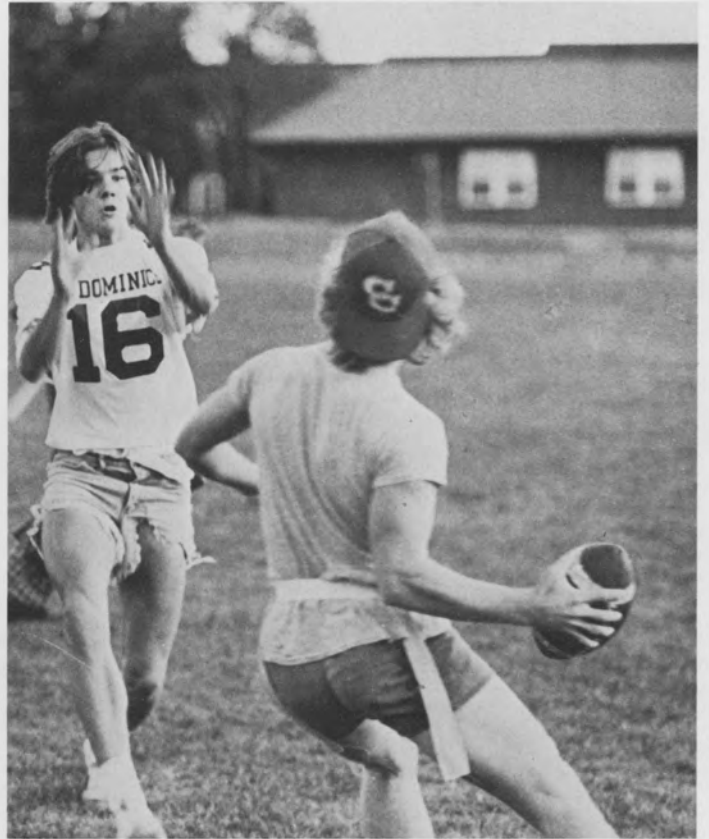


## *Golf*
